Waterfowl World Lesson Choices Grades K-5

<u>Lesson Plan Options: These represent quick summations of potential lesson designs.</u>

Activitiy: PP- Wonders of Waterfowl - nice overview of birds and then what makes waterfowl distinct ART/ SCI

Activity: Feather Facts: Children pull papers and share by reading out loud other uses of feathers besides the expected color/warmth/ flight SCI

Activity: Feather under Microscope – observe a feather close up and using hand lenses to look at various feathers SCI

Activity: Light as a Feather: Wind Tunnel Activity - put real feathers in – How do they move? Why? Test other objects for time and distance SCI/MATH

Activity- Beach Ball Fact Review/Expansion Game— Questions about Ducks are written on ball. Tossing game to review or expand knowledge about Duck behavior.

Activity- Paint Duck Heads Learn about types of ducks being painted ART/SCI

Activity- Life Cycle - READ Book: A New Duck -- - sit on nests as do story using PP version SCI

ART: Cycle of Life Wheel **ART**

Activity: Games – Waddle and Quack with balloon between legs Relay - SCI

Egg and Spoon Race to Nest- Relay

<u>Follow the Leader</u>: Leader chooses the duck behavior for everyone- switch <u>Duck, Duck Goose</u>: require the students to act like ducklings flapping their wings

and waddling like ducks as they play the game (K- 1 only)

VIDEO – An Original Duck-umentary – PBS: Nature – 1 hr in length. Can stop at any point- topics in segments SCI

Activity: Mallard Match Up: Ducks find their mate in the fall. Students will have to find their partners in this game. SCI

Activity: Visit the Duck Blind – view wildlife on pond and discuss safety SCI

Activity: Duck Facts and Word Find – handout SCI

Activity: Duck Weed – Up Close and Personal: Look at samples under hand lens- plant parts/importance to pond SCI

Activity: Have You Seen My Duckling /How do I know it's a duck? Learn to identify a duck by certain characteristics SCI

READ: Have You Seen My Duckling — Use Power Point or Book

Activity - Walk out to Willow Pond Duck Blind – see if spot our little ducklings – counting activity SCI/MATH

<u>Activity</u> – <u>10 is the Magic Number</u> - Students search along the trail for 2 egg halves that add up to 10 – a typical number of eggs a duck might lay for her brood. <u>SCI/MATH</u>

Activity: Make a Duck Call: simple straw design – mimic duck quack depending on how you blow it SCI/ART
