Why this discussion matters

Our older population is getting older and living longer

- The average lifespan of Americans in 2023 is 76
- There are currently 56+ million adults **over 65**
- You will most likely become a caregiver
 - Caregiver Crisis

By 2038, US could have more deaths than births

- In 2018 there were over 92.2 million adults over 55





End-of-Life Document Terminology (Can be very confusing!)

Advance care planning	Involves learning & thinking about your preferences for future healthcare needs
Advance Directive/s	A general term for a set of documents that designate your chosen health care decision maker (in the event you are incapable) and outlines your personal goals and values for future health care.
DNR	Do Not Resuscitate order
POLST https://polst.org/	A portable order for life sustaining treatment (a doctor's order) goes under several different titles, similar to Advance Directives

A closer look at Advance Directives:

Advance Directive/s	A general term for a set of documents that designate your <i>chosen health</i> care decision maker(in the event you are capable of making decisions) and
Also known as: • Advance Healthcare	outlines your personal goals and values for future healthcare care.
Directive/s	Can be comprised of:
	A Living Will
****	A Healthcare Power of Attorney
**Sometimes incorrectly	A DNR (Do Not Resuscitate) Order
referred to just as a Living Will	Donor Registry Enrollment Form (sometimes) https://www.donatelifenc.org/
Living Will	Instructions for your personal wishes for the type of care that you want in the event you are unable to speak for yourself - ONLY applies to health

A closer look at Advance Directives:

Health Care
Power of
Attorney

Thing 1: A **PERSON** chosen to make health care decisions for you in the event you are unable to.

Also known as: HCPOA, health care **proxy**, health care **agent**, health care **surrogate**, medical power of attorney, etc...

Health Care Power of Attorney

Thing 2: A LEGAL DOCUMENT appoints and authorizes a person of your choosing to speak for you in the event you are medically unable, MUST be at least 18, mentally competent, and MUST be signed with 2 witness and a Notary Public.

Also known as: *Durable* Power of Attorney for Health Care

Additional Terms to Know

Will

Also known as:

 Last Will and Testament Legal document that describes how a person's estate (property, money, financial assets) will be distributed and managed when they die.

 An executor is the person appointed to administer the last will and testament.

Durable (Financial) Power of Attorney

Also known as:

- DPA
- Legal agent
- Legal proxy
- General POA
- Special POA

A legal document that gives a trusted person of your choosing the authority to make legal and financial decisions for you in the case that you cannot make those decisions for yourself.

Also refers to the actual person





A group of people (often strangers) who get together over a hot beverage and dessert, to have the opportunity to informally talk about death.

- Bernard Crettaz, Swiss sociologist "Cafe Mortals" in 2004
- Jon Underwood Quit his job to bring bring the idea of "Death Cafes" to London in
 2011
- <u>Underwood passed away in 2017</u> from acute promyelocytic leukemia at the age of 44, stated it was "the most meaningful work of his life"
- By 2019, 6000+ death cafe events




BOOK: What To Do When I'm Gone: A Mother's Wisdom To Her Daughter


- Talking is easier over shared projects or crafts
 - Start a scrapbook using pictures of deceased loved ones & ask about what it was like to lose that person
 - Personal book of memories or stories, you type/write & listen, while they share
- Ask for help in preparing for your own future -
 - What would you do if you were me? What should I think about? Prepare for?
 - How did your parents or family handle death?
- Offer to visit the cemetery where a deceased loved one is buried.
